Report of the Special Committee on Civic Education

- 1. This year, as in the previous years, the Special Committee on Civic Education have organized (i) talks to secondary school students on the Rule of Law and other law-related topics, (ii) career talks to secondary school students and (iii) court visits by secondary schools.
- 2. The purpose of the programme is to introduce the practical operation of lawyers and Courts in Hong Kong, as well as the more "abstract" concept of Rule of Law, to secondary school students in Hong Kong. Faced with ever increasing challenges to its competitive edge, it is crucially important that young people in Hong Kong learn, at a young age, the importance of the Rule of Law in Hong Kong and how the Rule of Law has made Hong Kong stand out uniquely in this region as a place where fundamental values and human rights are truly safeguarded by law. This is particularly so in recent years, where controversial issues are litigated in the courts and where a number of commentaries are made about the role and function of the law, the courts in modern day Hong Kong. Students have shown great enthusiasm in such issues during our activities.
- 3. Our programme has grown from strength to strength. Not only has the number of participating schools continued to rise, the number of positive feedbacks from schools have convinced us that our time and efforts have been well spent. Many schools have become our regular supporters and participants, and some schools have even actively approached us to arrange for visits for their students. From time to time insightful, mature and piercing questions were raised by students on issues of constitutional law and civil liberties, and we are heartened by the responses shown by the younger generation during the visits and talks. On a lighter note our programme also serves to disabuse students of the (sometimes) dramatic and unrealistic depiction of courtroom operation seen on television.
- 4. A list of participating schools from the last AGM on 17th January 2013 to 16th January 2014 is attached to this report. The table includes schools who have taken part in the talks programme and the court visit programme. We hope that our programmes will continue to grow next year and in the years to come.

5. I would like to thank all the members of the Special Committee, as well as other members of the Bar and the Judiciary who have selflessly dedicated their time and effort in helping in the programmes and making them such a success.
