## Report of the Standing Committee on Overseas Admissions 2016

- 1. As of 31 December 2016, there were a total of 32 applications for the admission of overseas counsel to practise as a barrister in Hong Kong on an *ad hoc* basis, as opposed to 34 in 2015. Of the 32 applications, 19 were for criminal cases.
- 2. This year the Standing Committee consented to 19 applications, 12 of which were criminal cases. It opposed 12 applications, 7 of which were criminal cases.
- 3. The total number of applications allowed by the Court was 20 (of which 13 were criminal cases).
- 4. In 2015, the Bar Council adopted a new policy of seeking costs against the unsuccessful applicant in cases where it considers the application for admission to be hopeless. Such a costs order was granted for the first time by Poon JA in *Re Caplan QC* (HCMP 1084/2016, 5 August 2016). Members are reminded of their obligations when producing the junior counsel's certificate in support of the application as set out in the Guidelines issued by the Bar Council.
